

AZUL PLATINO

Description

Azul Platino is extracted from a city near Vigo, in Spain. The historic city of Vigo is also referred to as O Berbés. It is actually an old fishing port, mostly comprised of old one and two storey houses, all made of granite. Most of these houses were built during the 18th century and in the beginning of the 19th century. It is in O Berbés that the Collegiate of Christ of the Victory was built. Azul Platino has been used on the steps in Spain for hundreds of years. The cathedral Saint-Jacques-de-Compostelle, in Spain, is entirely built with granite from the region of Vigo. This granite is dense with a tight texture and can show a subtle black veining or small black spots Azul Platino goes very well with various styles. It is recommended for both commercial and residential uses.

Only one quarry produces this stone. Because of its incredible popularity in Europe and in the Middle-East, those who will have the chance of purchasing a parcel of this Spanish jewel will enhance their decor's grandeur and increase its timeless appeal.
